<b>Strengths:</b>	Excellent Accounting, Nursing, Business, Communication. Education, International Studies, Psychology, Music, and Theology programs. Internships are possible for all student for academic credit, student teaching opportunities are available for Education majors, and Clinicals are available for Nursing majors. Students may work on campus for up to 9 ½ hours per week.

<b>Criteria for Participation:</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• General completion of at least 1 year of study</li><li>• Min. GPA 2.75/or as appropriate at home institution.</li><li>• An official score report of the TOEFL (Minimum scores: paper based 550, computer based 213, internet based 80) or the IELTS (min. score: 6).</li><li>• A completed international student application.</li><li>• Certified copies of official school records.</li><li>• Two letters of recommendation from former professors and/or employers attesting to candidate's educational potential.</li><li>• Statement of Purpose – (500-word minimum essay outlining academic and professional goals with an explanation as to why you wish to study abroad at Bellarmine University).</li><li>• Bank statement showing financial support during the period abroad (per U.S. visa regulations)</li><li>• Copy of passport identification page</li></ul>
<b>Full-time Status:</b>	Student must be enrolled for a minimum of 12 hours, which constitutes full-time enrollment, and should consult their home advisor for further details on benefits, etc. under the exchange agreement. Typically, students register for 4 3-credit hour classes.
<b>Health History:</b>	A Bellarmine University Immunizations Form must be completed and submitted to the Director of Health Services. The form may be turned in upon arrival. <b>Health &amp; Evacuation Insurance:</b>	<b>Mandatory and available on campus</b> through Student Affairs. Students <b>MUST</b> purchase insurance via Bellarmine's approved international insurance provider (\$95* per month (5 months for 1 semester, 10 months for an academic year, paid in full prior to arrival).
